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## How have you dealt with conflict or confrontation in your work?

(Be clear on what happened, your approach, and the outcomes)

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## How have you worked with colleagues in healthcare to support a service user?

(With health and social care becoming more closely aligned you will need to show an understanding of the benefits of a collaborative approach)	
Could you tell us more about your understanding of Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards and when mental capacity assessments are appropriate?  (You may or may not have experience of this, but do be clear about whether you've had training or, if not, would accept training)
